





 4 Beats of silence
 Lowers the note by 1 half step
 Cancels a sharp or a flat
 Dynamic mark: Soft
 A note that receives one beat
 To emphasize a note
 A scale containing 5 notes
 Gradually getting louder
 Dynamic mark: Loud/Strong
 A note that receives half of a beat
 Gradually slowing down
 Gradually getting quieter
 The opposite of legato
 A curved line that indicates legato
 To hold a note longer than usual
 Raises the note by one half step
Dynamic mark: moderately quiet
